

As we come to the close of our 100th year, I first want to express gratitude for all of those who took time and energy honoring and celebrating this church's century of ministry. Personally, I learned a lot about what we've done, but even more about our DNA. It is fascinating to me to see the threads that connect us now to our founders and even beyond.

Our theme this year has been "Go with God." I hope this theme has helped to place our story within THE STORY and connect us with this ongoing call God has given to his people to Go...always with God. We have seen how this call played out in the faith journeys of the Old Testament saints and the ministry of Jesus, as well is in the lives of the Reformers and in the ministries of our first 100 years.

Now as we close the calendar year and begin a new church year (with the Advent season), we ask again how God is calling us to GO. As the Leadership Team has met in recent months, we find ourselves using the language of a ministry called "Fresh Expressions." Just meditating on the name is inspiring, in my opinion. How will the Gospel of Jesus Christ be expressed in fresh ways in our time and place?

Over 100 years, the Word of God has been preached, hospitality has been practiced, children have been taught, and neighbors have been served...but how might these core values and calling be expressed in fresh ways in years to come?

The Advent season is about waiting and watching for God. And Christmas tells us that God often shows up in places the most religious among us hadn't thought to look. This Advent, may our eyes and ears be re-attuned to see where Christ is already showing up, and may we have the courage of the Magi and Shepherds to seek out and embrace these fresh expressions of the Good News.






# Advent Series: What are we waiting for?


