From the Desk of the Pastor ...

I don't know if you've driven downtown lately, but lots is happening. ProMedica is moving in, and there is construction all over getting the place ready for them. One of the buildings that is being renovated is the old steam plant. As it turns out, the way the building was structured is unable to serve the purposes of the new residents. And really, that's how it should be: structure should serve purpose.



A few years ago, we realized that our structure as a church was not serving our purpose. What had worked for many years—the boards—was no longer working. We found ourselves spending a lot of time trying to serve our structures: trying to get more people to be on boards and trying to replenish board members who were feeling burned out. Our purposes were serving our structures, not the other way around. That kind of thing happens over time in any organization.

So we got rid of the structure. I know for the past couple years, some of you have been wondering where you fit in without that structure. Our leaders have sensed that and heard that. I get it. So over the last few months, our Leadership Team has been discerning how we can re-develop structures that serve our purpose. And we think we're onto something.



On June 26th, we're looking forward to sharing that with you. And what better setting for talking about our church's future than a hymn sing and ice cream brunch? Seriously, it doesn't get any better than that.

One other note. What is demanded of the church in this day and age is vastly different than what was demanded in the day when the board structure was developed. We're trying to think about structure less in terms of a big building, and more in terms of a human skeleton—not to contain things, but to empower movement, flexibility, and adaptation. So we hope we're on the right track, and hope that you are ready to take your place once again—or for the first time in what we like to call The Body of Christ.

ELIZABETHAN NEWS: On May 2nd, the Elizabethans small


