

"Politics" as a word gets a pretty bad rap in our society—even when it's not talking about our elected government. Here's an example: I was talking to a neighbor about his son who plays travel soccer. We talked about some of the challenges involved and our hope that the "politics" don't ruin the boy's love for the game.

In our society, "politics" tends to conjure up ideas of divisiveness, corruption, and hypocrisy. And that's not even getting into our ideas about "politicians."

The result of this all is that many of us either go all in—
"Candidate X will save us all!"—or all out—"They're all screwed
up. Forget it!" To complicate matters is that the dominant voices
that influence our political views are from the media, which—
depending on which outlet you get your "news" from—tend to
stick with what gets ratings and what reinforces the beliefs of
their audience. Friends, it is complicated.

All of this complexity can obscure what "politics" really is: how we human beings engage in the work of ordering our society alongside our neighbors. Far from being reduced to a choice between two presidential candidates, politics is about the world we want to live in, and doing our part in helping it become more like that. This may not make for sensationalized headlines, but I hope it reframes what we're doing as citizens and as followers of Jesus.

Because Jesus was political. How Jesus lived and what Jesus taught had a significant impact on how his followers impacted the society in which they lived. Jesus didn't get executed because he stayed out of politics, but because he challenged political assumptions and influenced political conversation so dramatically.

We are going to be bombarded with political messages this fall. And so it may feel like coming to church should provide a respite from all of this. But friends, worship is not an escape from the world. Worship is the team huddle that instructs our life the rest of the week. Jesus has something to say about how we engage in the politics of our society, and we need to let Jesus speak. I hope you will listen, engage, and yes, let your voice be heard, as we open up our political assumptions, leanings, and behavior to the instruction of our True King.


